PARISH COUNCIL AGM MEETING:

20TH JANUARY UPDATE ON FABRIC ISSUES

Works done last week: Walls of the main Church seating area were cleaned again of falling rubbles as a temporary measure (costing £280 + VAT). Hall insulation enquiries were made and application for funding was submitted.

Priority works to be done: to replace the skews above the sanctuary (roofing company offered it to do FREE, start date to be second half of January), to replace wood in sanctuary ceiling affected by wet rot; to clear the walls and stop debris falling *Funds we have:* ca. £6000, but this will have to cover the running costs as well (monthly gas, electricity, Diocesan levies, clergy support, joint costs with St. Peter's, etc.), and we still have to pay a final bill of £4600 for the roof repair.

<u>Latest GAS Bill</u>: £532 for December alone. Please make sure that whoever leaves the hall last switches off the heating, to reduce energy and finance waste. Thank you. Fr. Gabor

Bishop Robert Barron's commentary on the various parts of Mass (a summary): The Introductory Part (continued) Liturgy of the Word: It is the moment of encounter with God

- all of reality speaks of God
- but in the history of Israel that speech becomes more clear, focussed and intelligible
- in this final age God spoke to us through His Son
- Christ is calling out to His mystical Body and the Body speaks back
- When we listen the divine interpreter, the Holy Spirit, interprets God's Word
- There is always some story in the Bible that makes sense to our lives
- There is a more fundamental story to our lives than what is in the history books: it is about where we come from (Book of Genesis), where sin comes from and how we are saved and brought back to God our Creator through Christ's saving death and our response to His love
